From August 2023-January 2024 the GHMBC developed a bran new series of mindful yoga videos. There are 36 new videos in this series that connect directly to the GHMBC curriculum. The series are bi-weekly and include 3 videos for each bi-weekly series. The videos were designed to be shown on Mondays (Mindful Monday), Wednesdays (Mindfulness in Action), and Fridays (Friday Flow). All of the videos in the series introduce a new

mindfulness concept to the children, while also reinforcing concepts and vocabulary learned in the GHMBC curriculum.

This video-based program sent home a sequence of videos staring families and teachers teaching developmental and academic skills that they self-identified as their own family strengths. The videos also included community members reading books related to the concept families are sharing with each other and yoga videos developed and created by the University of Mississippi's Growing Healthy Bodies Minds and Communities (GHBMC) team. Finally, this project aimed to inspire, connect, empower and nourish the well-being of each child while recognizing the vast funds of knowledge that already exist in homes throughout the Mississippi Delta.

## **OTHER CREATIVE WORK**

**Stapp, A.,** Wolff, K., Miller, S. E., Lambert, L., & Mann, G. (2020-2022). We applied as a team and were selected as part of the first UM 2020 cohort for the **INterdiSciPlInary REsearch Development (INSPiRED) Program**. This 2-year program focuses on training and equipping faculty with the skills and resources they will need to effectively work in large, multi-disciplinary research teams, and with centers and research-centric administrative offices. As the lead of this interdisciplinary team we went through an intensive 2-day interdisciplinary and team science training last summer and have attended 10 bi-monthly lunch-n-learn sessions since September 2020, with 7 left to complete by May 2021. Our team also meets monthly to discuss and apply what we've learned from the sessions to our research. To date, our group has submitted 2 grants (UM-achieving equity and Spencer) so far this academic year, with a 3rd one (USDA) will be submitted May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021.

This model addresses the major challenges that early childhood educators face communities across the nation; obesity, poverty, inequality, and behavioral issues through education and community-engaged research. During phases II-IV we wrote and piloted 8 units (32) lessons) and 16 corresponding yoga videos that span the course of the school year with 23 PreK4 teachers in 5 schools across North Mississippi. The units were developed to align with the common OWL Pre-K curriculum. During phase V (2023-2024) we have adjusted our curriculum to align with the new Mississippi curriculum entitled, New Beginnings. In addition, we added parental engagement during 2021-2023, where newsletter snippets are sent home each week regarding reinforcement of the pilot curriculum, a virtual cook at home event was provided for hundreds of GHMBC families, and students take a summer bag that includes a GHMBC kit with learning resources and activities for families to enjoy with their children and extend the learning from the GHMBC curriculum at home. During Phase IV we were able to provide additional family engagement nights within the schools in both Greenwood and Sunflower County as well as add a garden at a school in Sunflower County.
